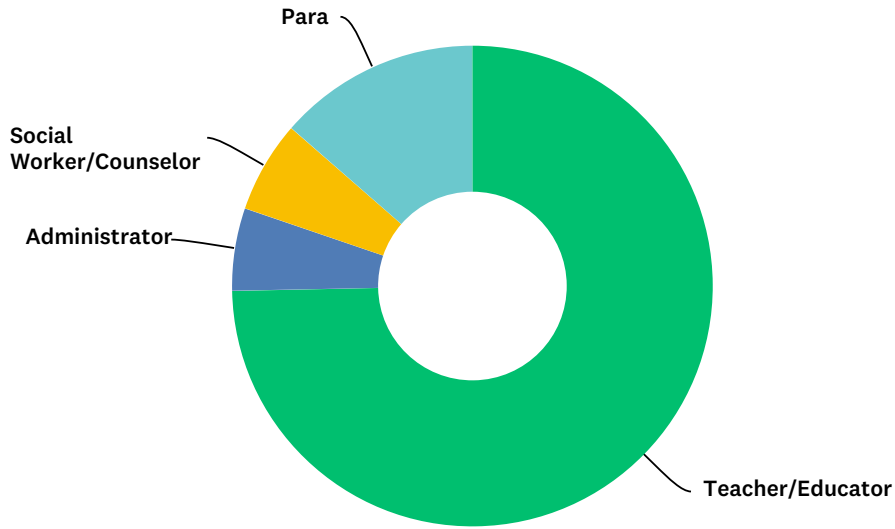

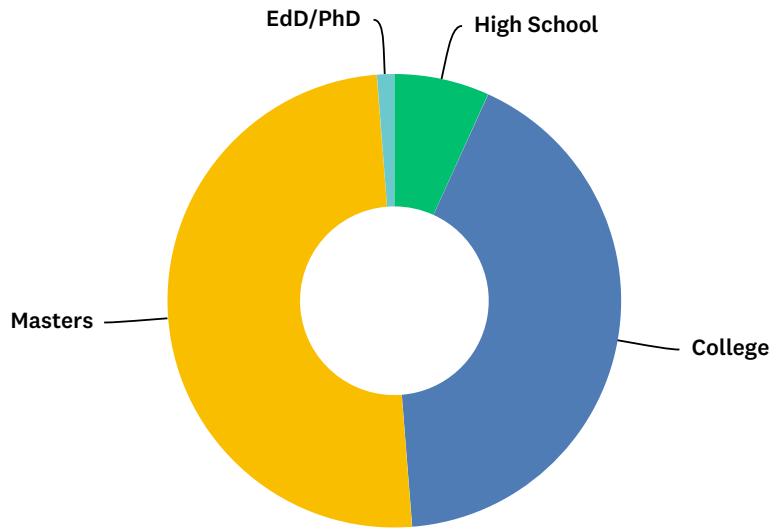

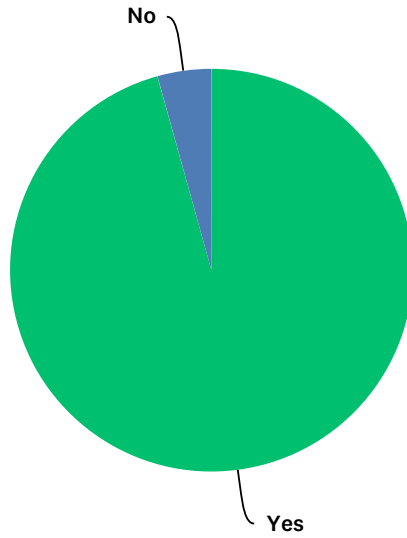

# Do you believe there socio-economic disparities in your school district?

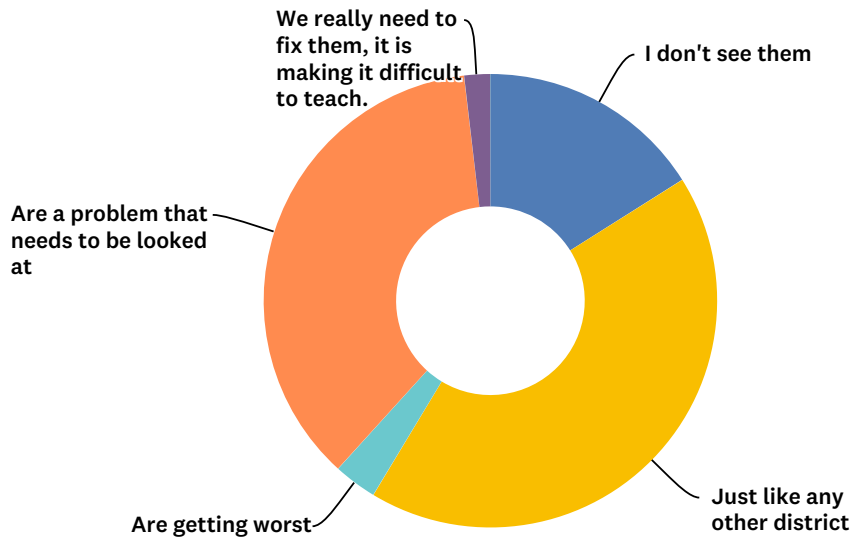

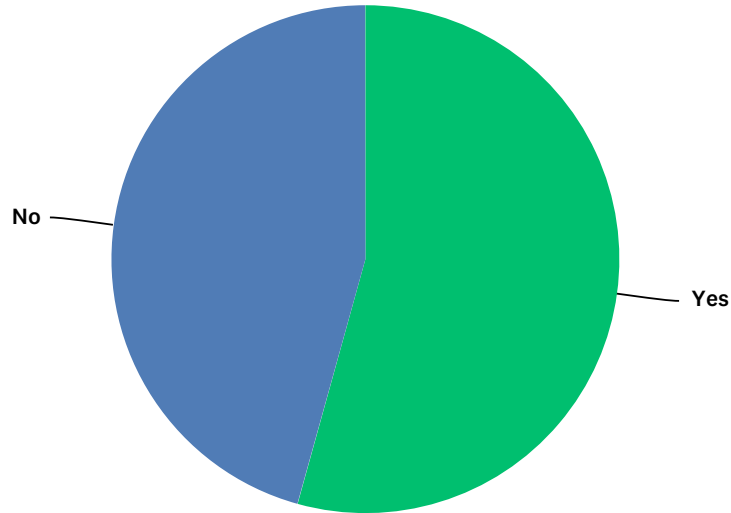

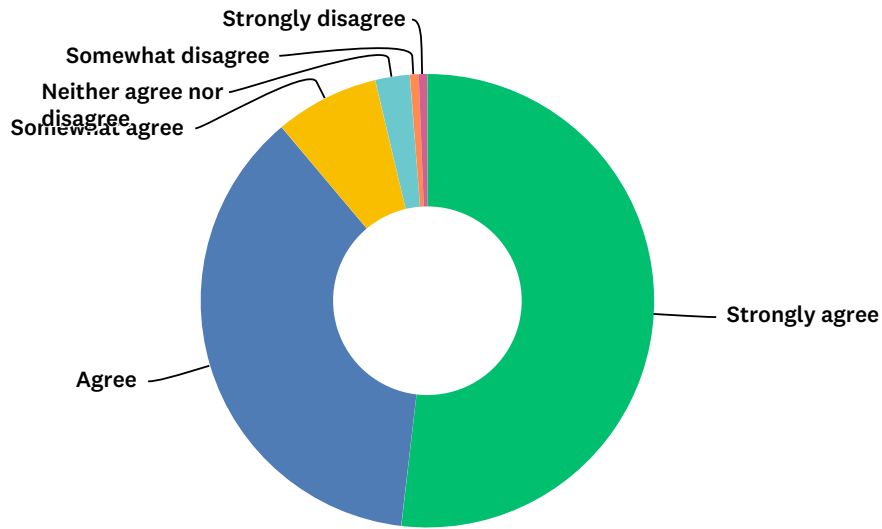

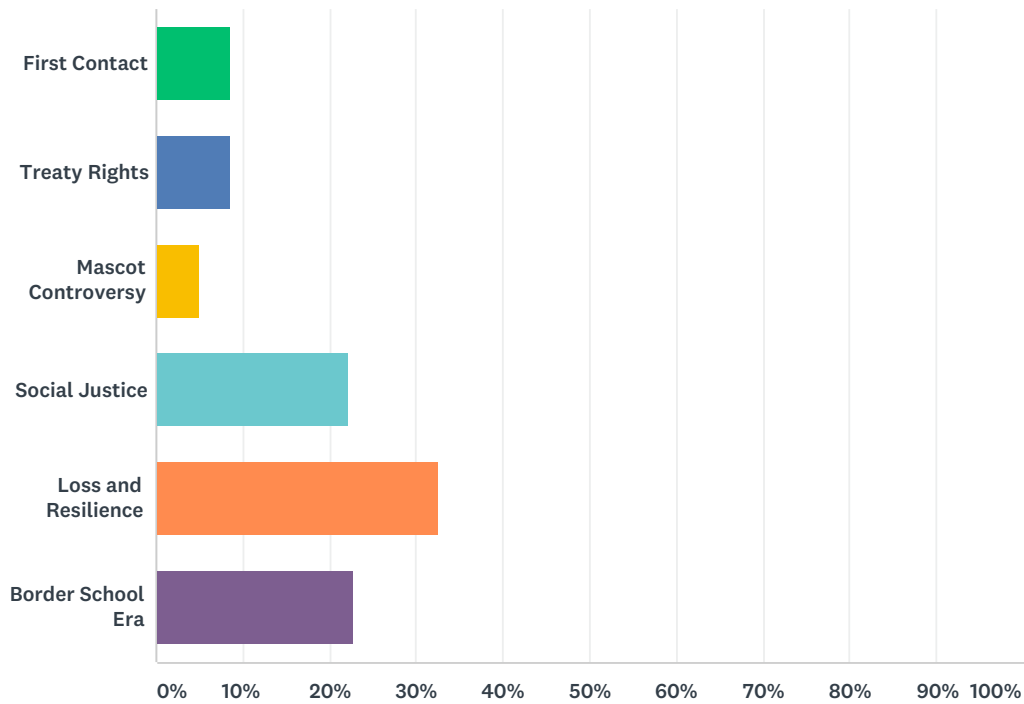

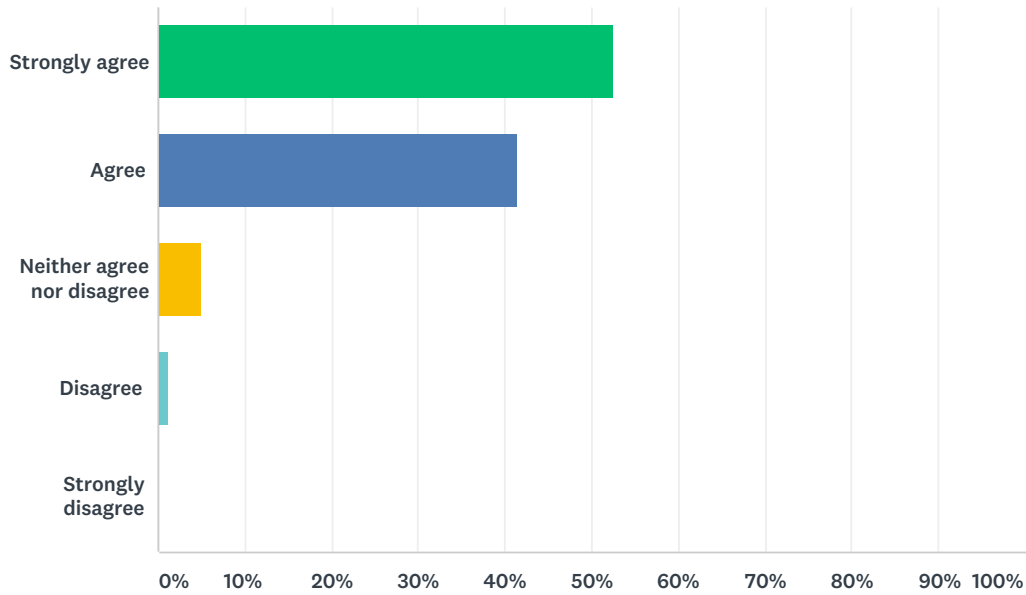

## Would you recommend this film to your colleagues?

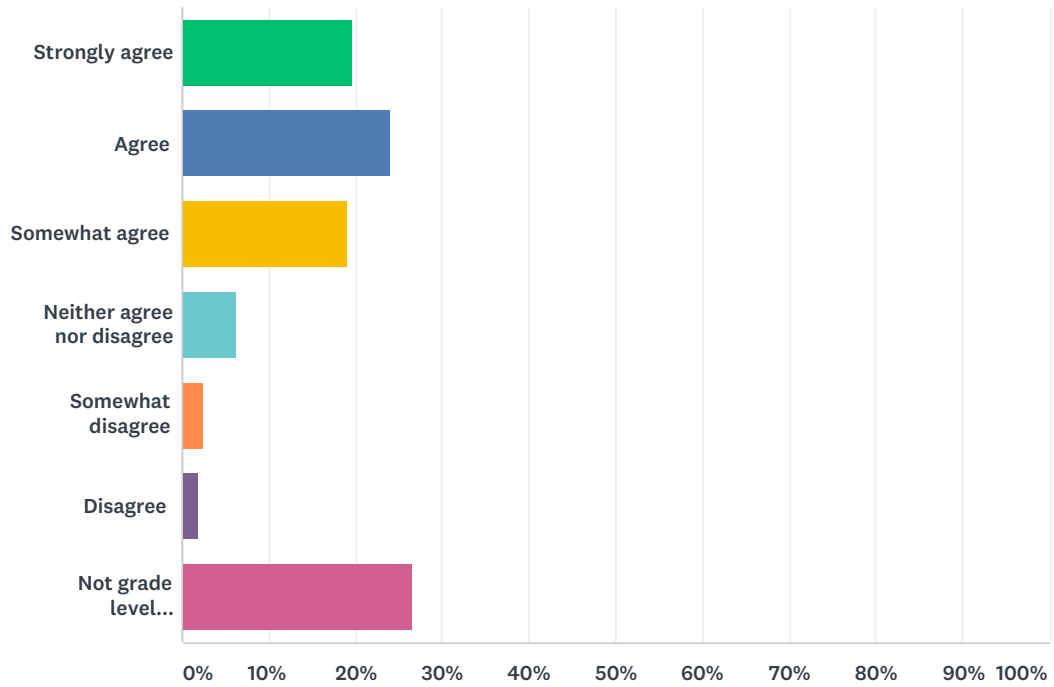

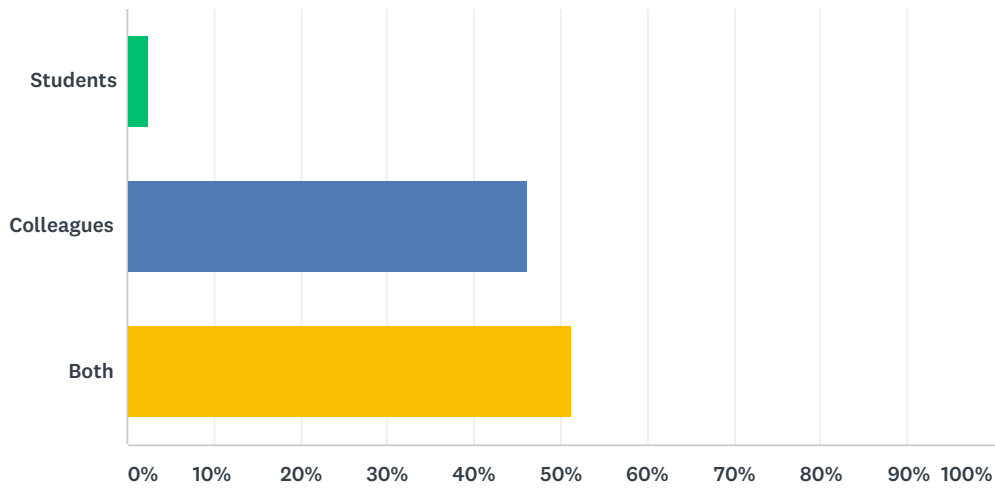

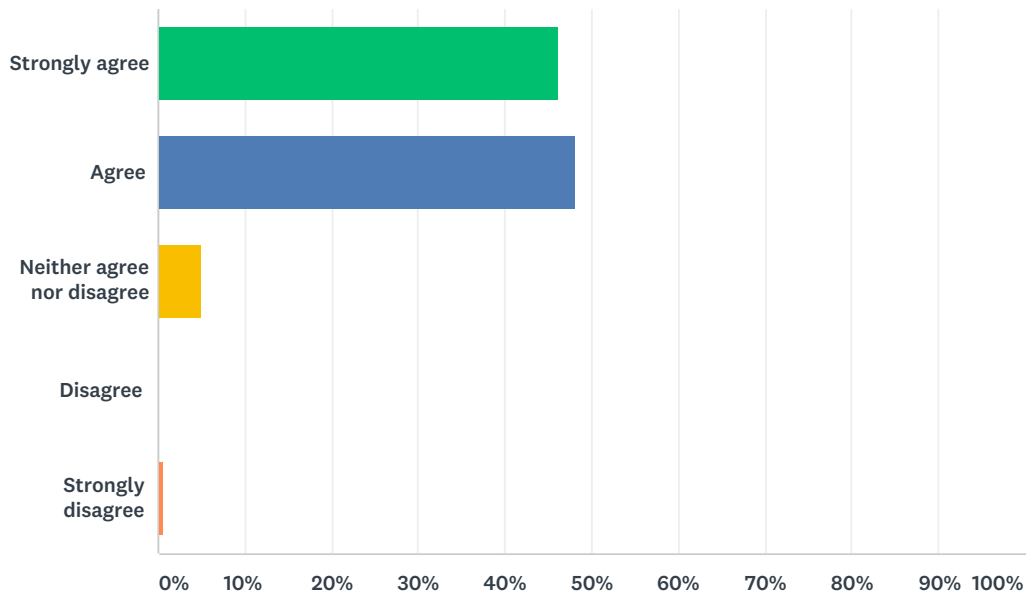

## Watching Dodging Bullets helps me better understand the challenges faced by Native Americans?

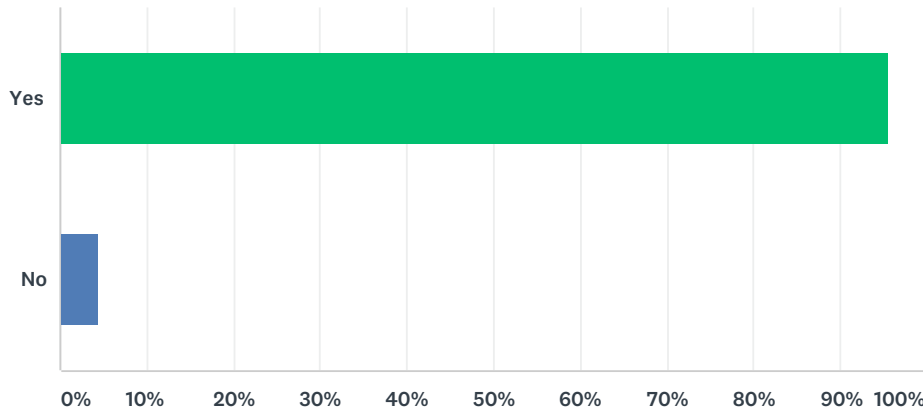

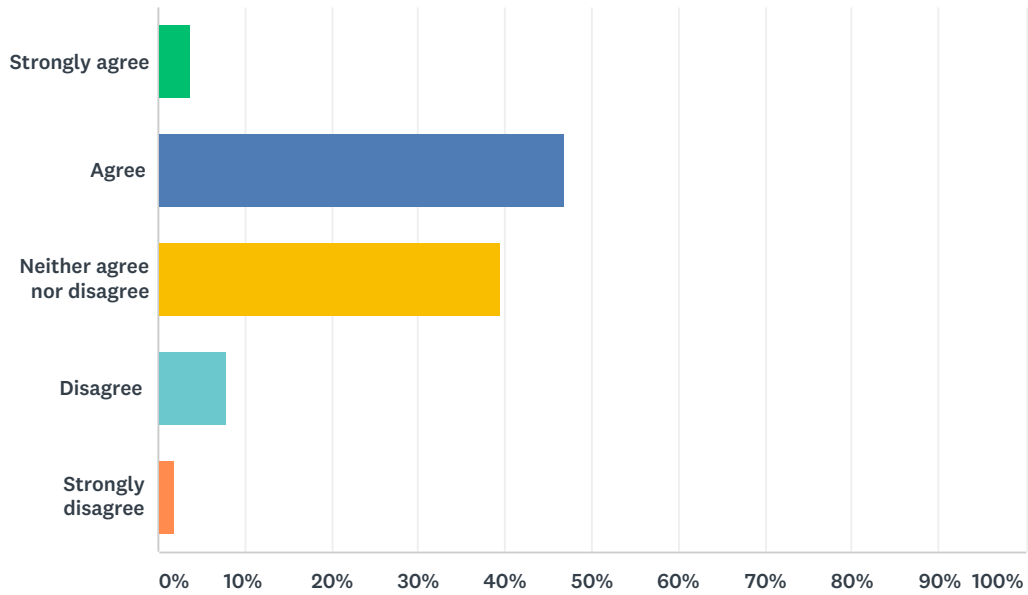
